

The tables that normally live in the dining room are as follows:

- 2 rectangle tables (8' x 3') that seat 10
- 1 rectangle table (6' x 34") that seats 8
- 2 rectangle tables (5' x 34") that seat 6
- 1 round table (4') that seats 5
- 5 round tables (3'6") that seats 4
- 1 square (3' x 3') that seats 4

Options/Ideas:

- Use these tables plus a few of our folding tables to seat 65-75
- Use only the rectangles and supplement with rented farmhouse tables (the beautiful tri-plank wooden tables at this link: <http://www.celebrateinvermont.com/tables>) if you like the natural wood look of the dining room and plan to have naked tables with only runners, etc.
- You'll need to consider tablecloths if we supplement with MML folding tables.
- We'll help you with layout, depending on the size of the guest list. Some options are "king's table" layout with all the tables end-to-end, horseshoes, multiple rows of tables (like a summer camp mess hall!), or, of course, the typical island-like set up with tables scattered.
- Consider if you'd like to sit at a "sweetheart table" which is a table for just the bride and groom. If you do, think about if you'd like that take to be front-and-center or out of the limelight.
- If a sweetheart table isn't for you, will you place yourself at a regular table with a few other guests, or do you want a head table (a table larger than the others so it can seat the entire bridal party and their dates).
